### Chief Complaint

"I want to restart my medications."

### HPI

28yo female who is medically admitted for pyelonephritis. Patient reportedly stopped psychiatric medications 6 months ago and wants to restart medications and restart with psychiatrist. Social work has been consulted and provided patient with information for outpatient psychiatry.

Patient reports that she stopped taking her medications 6 months ago due to cost. She had recently lost her job and stopped taking medications due to finances. Patient notes that her mood has been unstable with anxiety and poor sleep. She notes anxiety and sleep were better managed when on medication. She denies recent SI, plan and intent. She denies violent thoughts.

Patient reports she wants to engage as an outpatient with psychiatry and wants to start medication when inpatient.



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## **Examination/Mental Status**

General Appearance and Behavior: Patient is dressed appropriately. Observed sitting on bed. Pleasant & cooperative with interview with good eve contact. Orientation: Awake, alert & oriented to person, place and time. Motor: No psychomotor abnormalities noted Speech/language: Normal rate, rhythm tone, & volume with fluent language. Thought Process: Linear, logical and goal-directed. Associations: Logical/Relevant. Thought Content: Negative suicidal content and negative homicidal content of thought; No psychotic manifestations noted. Mood: "Normal". Affect: Euthymic with full range. Attention/Concentration: Intact to interview. Fund of Knowledge: Adequate. Memory: Within normal limits. Insight: Fair. Judgement: Intact. Impulse Control: Intact to interview.

# Treatment

#### Plan

39yo female who is medically admitted for pyelonephritis. Patient is not currently displaying symptoms of an acute psychiatric illness and wishes to restart medication. She states mood was better managed when on Prozac 20mg. Recommend restarting Prozac 20mg. Risks, benefits and side effects were reviewed. Patient provides verbal consent to restart Prozac 20mg daily.

Current suicide risk assessment estimated to be low. She is denying any suicidal ideations. Denies history of suicide attempts or self-harm. She is motivated for treatment.
